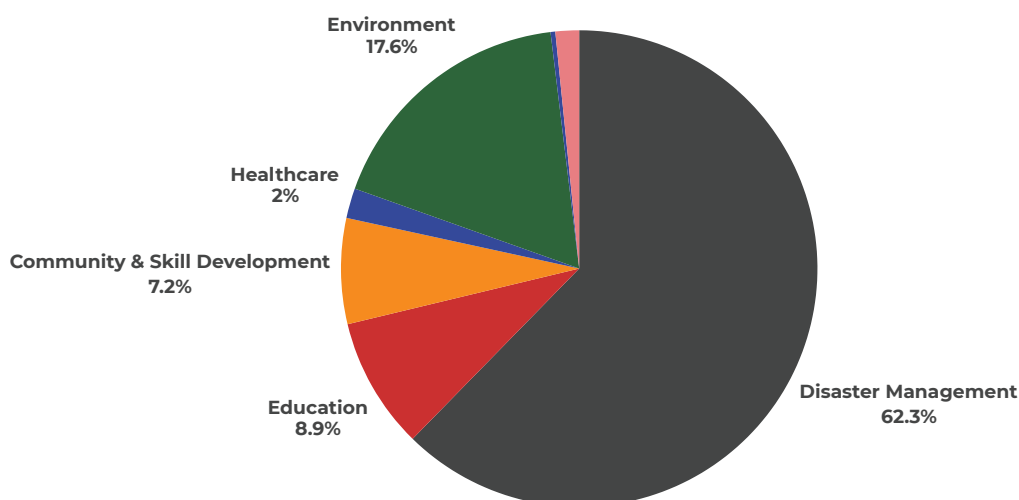

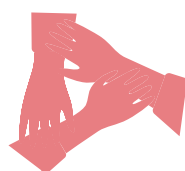

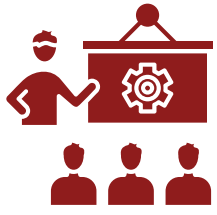

Police and Hartek foundation sign MoU to advance gender-responsive road safety

In a landmark move toward inclusive and sustainable mobility, the Traffic and Road Safety Wing of Punjab Police signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Hartek Foundation today, establishing a collaborative framework aimed at advancing road safety through a gender-responsive and data-driven approach. Additionally, this partnership shall support R&D on enhancing the visibility and safety of the traffic of officials on the road through solar powered infrastructure like traffic aid posts, halting stations, solar helmets etc.

The MoU reflects a shared commitment to strengthening road safety systems by collecting and utilizing sex- and age-disaggregated data, addressing gender disparities in transport infrastructure, and creating safer, more accessible public spaces. It also envisions increasing the participation of women in both decision-making and operational roles in the transport and public safety sectors. The first initiative under this MoU is the launch of the Punjab Police-Hartek Foundation Fellowship "SAAHAS" (Safe Access and Advancement for Her through Awareness and Sustainability). This pioneering fellowship—India's first of its kind initiated by a Police Department—will be implemented through the Punjab Road Safety and Traffic Research Centre. It aims to support research, innovation, and on-ground interventions that promote gender-equitable mobility solutions in alignment with SDG 3.9 and 11.

A.S. Rai, IPS, ADGP (Traffic and Road Safety), Punjab, stated, "The SAHAAS Fellowship is a bold step toward building inclusive and sustainable road safety systems. This is just the beginning—many more initiatives will emerge under this partnership to reshape the future of mobility in Punjab."

Hartek Foundation partners with Punjab Police & J-PAL to Build Women leaders in policing

CHANDIGARH: In a significant step toward strengthening gender-responsive and community-centric policing across Punjab, Hartek Foundation, in partnership with the Community Affairs Division (CAD) of Punjab Police and J-PAL South Asia, conducted a three-day Training of Trainers (TOT) programme at the Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur. The programme brought together 80 women police personnel from 14 districts of Punjab, marking one of the most comprehensive capacity-building efforts aimed at advancing women's leadership within the state police force.

Designed to bolster professional development and leadership skills, the programme provides women police officers with structured facilitation skills, enhances teamwork, and deepens their understanding of gender-responsive policing. These competencies are essential for delivering positive, community-centric outcomes across police stations," said Gurpreet Kaur Deo, Spl. DGP, IPS.

During the inaugural session, Ms. Harkirat Kaur, CEO, Hartek Foundation, outlined the role and responsibilities of master trainers and highlighted the strategic importance of this partnership. She said, "This initiative reflects our commitment to nurturing women leaders within the policing system. By strengthening

To integrate, strengthen women in force, Punjab Police launches project

THE PUNJAB Police has rolled out a state-wide initiative to strengthen the role and integration of women officers, beginning with a three-day Training of Trainers programme at the Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur.

The "Mainstreaming of Women Police" project, led by the Community Affairs Division in partnership with the Hartek Foundation, trained around 60 master trainers from 13 districts. Each district sent four senior officers who will now conduct training sessions across their jurisdictions.

The curriculum covered modules on shaping police conduct, gender sensitisation, delivering justice to underserved groups and strategies to integrate women personnel in a traditionally male-dominated force. The training also stressed the responsibility of senior officers in supporting the professional growth of women police personnel.

Special DGP, Community Affairs Division, Gurpreet Kaur Deo said the initiative is part of a larger evidence-based assessment of the nationwide women helpdesk project, under which two women officials have been deployed in each of Punjab's 384 police stations. "This ambitious project aims to build capacity for gender-responsive policing," she said.

For a scientific assessment of the programme's impact, Punjab Police has signed an MoU with the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL), which will conduct Randomised Controlled Trials. Of the 384 police stations, 288 will undergo the training, while 96 will serve as control stations.

The 100 to 120 master trainers selected for the project will receive a second round of advanced training in February 2026. They will then conduct training across the 288 police stations in three phases between March and June 2026, covering issues such as gender stereotypes within policing culture, evolving policing needs, cybercrime, crimes against women and children, and police response and behaviour.

J-PAL will conduct a baseline survey in participating stations before the district-level training begins, followed by an endline survey of both police personnel and citizens to assess changes in gender perceptions and the roles of women in policing. A second Training of Trainers session for officers from the remaining 15 districts is scheduled at PPA Phillaur later this month. In all, over 2,000 police officials are expected to be trained as part of the project.

The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Forest Department and the Gram Panchayat, organized a large-scale tree plantation drive in Village Kasoli, Punjab. The event engaged over 150 participants, including local SHGs, to foster community-led environmental sustainability and a greener future.



In a dedicated effort to promote environmental sustainability and raise awareness about responsible waste management, Hartek Foundation led a comprehensive cleanliness drive in Village Daun, located in the Mohali district of Punjab. To support the “Beat Plastic Pollution” campaign and promote responsible waste management practices, separate dustbins for dry and wet waste were thoughtfully installed at the event site.

STUDENTS SUPPORTED

Hartek Foundation positively impacted students and youth through education focused interventions, including safety awareness, menstrual hygiene, first aid and disaster preparedness, mental wellness and school infrastructure improvements. These initiatives promoted safe, inclusive and well equipped learning environments while strengthening life skills and social awareness among adolescents.



Hartek Foundation organised a one-day awareness session on POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) at Government Senior Secondary School, Bakarpur. The initiative aimed to promote body safety, consent, boundaries, and protection from sexual abuse among adolescents. The session was facilitated by Ms. Manjula Sularia, a renowned expert in child safety and gender sensitization.



In celebration of World Environment Day, the Hartek Foundation promoted sustainability by donating a water tank to Government Senior Secondary School, Bakarpur, and hosting an awareness session with the Green Planet Society. The initiative included planting fruit-bearing trees and distributing saplings to students to encourage environmental responsibility.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Family Planning Association of India (FPAI), conducted an awareness session on menstrual health for girls and personal hygiene for boys at the School of Eminence in Bakarpur Village, Punjab. This initiative aimed to promote physical well-being and break social taboos through open dialogue, ensuring adolescents have the knowledge to maintain healthy hygiene practices.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Punjab Police Community Affairs Division and the Red Cross Society, Mohali, conducted First Aid and Disaster Management training for Student Police Cadets at Government High School, Nagal Salempur. The program provided hands-on training in life-saving techniques like CPR and fracture management, empowering youth to respond effectively to medical emergencies and disasters.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Punjab Police Community Affairs Division, the Centre for Social Work at Panjab University, and Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University, organized a training program on "Stress Management and Emotional Wellness" for Social Work Day. The event focused on mental health and emotional well-being, engaging 153 participants, including physiotherapy students and police officials



To foster a more structured and disciplined learning environment, Hartek Foundation facilitated the installation of a fully automated bell system at the School of Eminence, Bakarpur. This initiative aimed to enhance school operations by ensuring timely class transitions, minimizing disruptions, and optimizing the overall learning experience.

SKILLS ENABLED

Hartek Foundation implemented community and skill development initiatives in collaboration with government departments and civil society organizations, benefiting men, women, children, senior citizens, persons with disabilities and individuals undergoing drug rehabilitation. The Foundation supported DDRC patients through livelihood activities, conducted Yuva Saanjh awareness and capacity-building sessions, promoted gender sensitization and mainstreaming of women police, organized Langar Seva, welfare programs, and strengthened child development through sports infrastructure initiatives.



Hartek Foundation, with Punjab Police (Community Affairs Division) and J-PAL South Asia, conducted a three-day Batch 1 Training of Trainers programme to promote women's mainstreaming in policing. Guided by the Special DGP, the programme focused on gender-responsive policing, legal frameworks, training pedagogy, gender sensitisation, and life skills. 80 senior officers were trained as Master Trainers to cascade learning across the force.



Hartek Foundation and the Community Affairs Division concluded the three-day Batch 2 ToT programme at Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur. Led by Special DGP Ms. Gurpreet Kaur Deo IPS, the initiative has trained 120+ police officials as Master Trainers to strengthen gender equality, inclusive leadership, and gender-responsive policing across Punjab Police.



Yuva Saanjh Training Session, conducted to brief and engage in discussions with senior officials on the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for Yuva Saanjh and youth-centric community engagement initiatives.



Hartek Foundation launched a computer training program at the Sector 66 Rehabilitation Centre in Mohali under its Hartek Skill Lab initiative. This patient-centric program aims to aid rehabilitation by teaching essential digital skills, including basic operations, typing, and internet usage. By offering hands-on, personalized training, the Foundation is empowering participants with the technical competence needed to build a stronger future.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Punjab Police, organized a Nukkad Natak (street play) in Mohali to mark the International Day Against Drug Abuse as part of the Yuva Saanjh Project. Using impactful street theatre, the initiative raised awareness among the youth about the dangers of drug addiction and illicit trafficking. The event successfully promoted the importance of making informed, drug-free choices to build a healthier and safer community.



We successfully concluded the quarter at the Hartek Skill Lab in DDRC Mohali, where over the past three years, we have trained more than 200 patients in skill development and therapeutic engagement.



Public Welfare Interventions To enhance public spaces and promote community well-being, Hartek Foundation inaugurated a Community Park in Village Bakarpur. The park is designed to provide a safe, inclusive, and accessible environment for all age groups.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with CAD Punjab Police, facilitated a Yuva Saanjh training pre-session at PPOI, Chandigarh. Hartek Foundation supported rural healthcare through blood donation initiatives and health camps in Villages Daun, Kasoli, Jyanti, and Khijrabad, focusing on breast and cervical cancer awareness and general check-ups. Menstrual hygiene sessions were conducted for adolescent girls at the School of Eminence, Bakarpur, while artificial limbs were provided to persons with disabilities in collaboration with Narayana Seva Sansthan, improving healthcare access in underserved communities.



Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital, organized a comprehensive Awareness Session and Early Detection Camp at Khizrabad Village, SAS Nagar, in observance of Breast Cancer Awareness week. The initiative aimed to promote early detection and preventive healthcare practices among rural women. The session saw the participation of over 80 individuals



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with PARK Hospital, organized a free health camp in Village Daun, providing essential medical checkups to over 100 SHG members and their families.



A blood donation drive was organized at Hartek Group HO in collaboration with PGIMER Chandigarh, with all collected units donated to PGIMER. Hartek Foundation remains committed to championing social causes and contributing positively to society through consistent, well-organized initiatives in the areas of health, education, sustainability, and community development.



Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with Narayan Seva Sansthan, facilitated the distribution of 50 artificial limbs to individuals with physical disabilities. This initiative aimed to restore mobility and independence, enabling beneficiaries to actively participate in education, employment, and community life.

Empowering 250+ women across 30 Self Help Groups (SHGs), Hartek Foundation strengthened economic independence through skill-based livelihoods and institutional partnerships. With initiatives ranging from tailoring and stitching to Phulkari integration into corporate supply chains, women earned an average monthly income of ₹14,000, fostering entrepreneurship, confidence and long-term financial security.



In collaboration with the Meharba Trust, the Hartek Foundation is empowering local women artisans by integrating handcrafted Phulkari into its corporate supply chain. By commissioning Phulkari file folders from Self-Help Groups (SHGs), the initiative provides financial stability and exhibition platforms for these craftswomen.



The Hartek Foundation has established the Hartek Skill Lab and Learning Centre to empower 30 Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and 250 women in rural Punjab. Equipped with 15 automatic sewing machines and professional training, the centre has partnered with the Punjab State Rural Livelihoods Mission (PSRLM) to stitch 50,000 government school uniforms. By providing the necessary infrastructure for large-scale production, the initiative ensures fair remuneration and sustainable financial security for local women.
