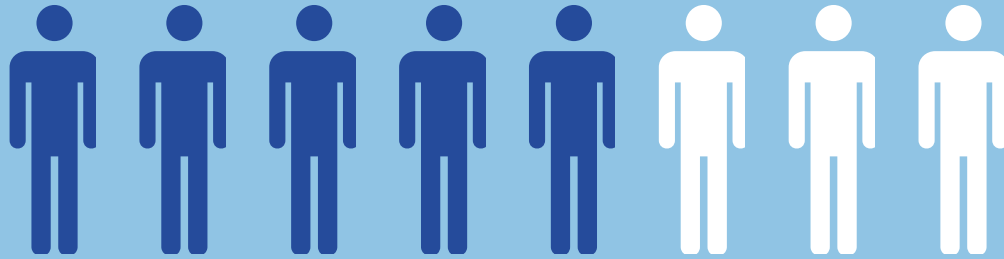

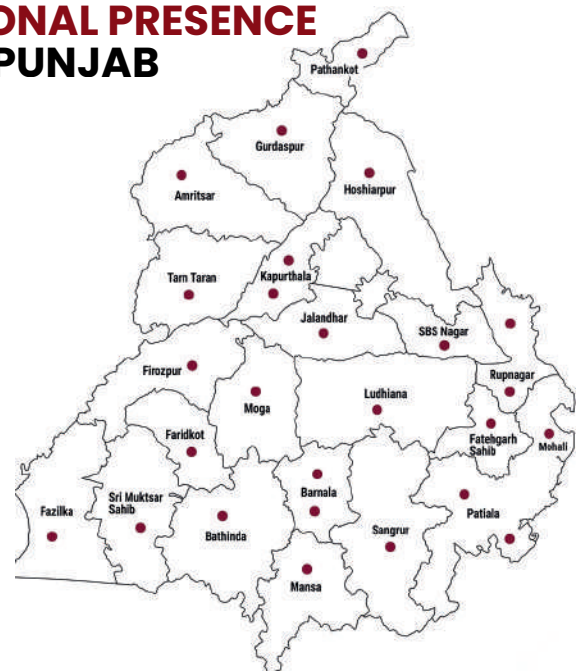

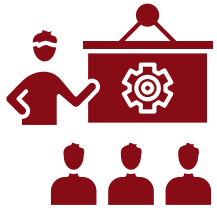

# HARTEK FOUNDATION – PROGRESS SUMMARY

## 1 — Disaster Management & Emergency Response

- Supported flood-affected families in Hoshiarpur, Gurdaspur and Ferozepur with solar lights, essential supplies, temporary relief, and rehabilitation including rebuilding 10 homes with electrical fittings.

## 2 — Education & Child-Centric Interventions

- Inaugurated two STEM Labs in Government schools (Kharar, Mullanpur) promoting hands-on, real-life learning and development of curiosity, critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills.

**Police and Hartek foundation sign MoU to advance gender-responsive road safety**

In a landmark move toward inclusive and sustainable mobility, the Traffic and Road Safety Wing of Punjab Police signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Hartek Foundation today, establishing a collaborative framework aimed at advancing road safety through a gender-responsive and data-driven approach. Additionally, this partnership shall support MoU on enhancing the visibility and safety of the traffic of officials on the road through solar-powered infrastructure like traffic and potholes, halting stations, solar helmets etc.

The MoU reflects a shared commitment to strengthening road safety systems by collecting and utilizing sex- and age-disaggregated data, addressing gender disparities in transport infrastructure, and creating safer, more accessible public spaces. It also envisions increasing the participation of women in both decision-making and operational roles in the transport and public safety sectors. The first initiative under this MoU is the launch of the Punjab Police-Hartek Foundation Fellowship "SAAHAS" (Safe Access and Advancement for Her through Awareness and Sustainability). This pioneering fellowship - India's first of its kind initiated by a Police Department - will be implemented through the Punjab Road Safety and Traffic Research Centre. It aims to support research, innovation, and on-ground interventions that promote gender-equitable mobility solutions in alignment with SDG 3.9, and 11.

A.S. Rai, IPS, ADGP (Traffic and Road Safety), Punjab, stated, "The SAAHAS Fellowship is a bold step toward building inclusive and sustainable road safety systems. This is just the beginning - many more initiatives will emerge under this partnership to reshape the future of mobility in Punjab."

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**Hartek Foundation partners with Punjab Police & J-PAL to Build Women leaders in policing**

CHANDIGARH: In a significant step toward strengthening gender-responsive and community-centric policing across Punjab, Hartek Foundation, in partnership with the Community Affairs Division (CAD) of Punjab Police and J-PAL South Asia, conducted a three-day Training of Trainers (TOT) programme at the Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur. The programme brought together 80 women police personnel from 15 districts of Punjab, marking one of the most comprehensive capacity-building efforts aimed at advancing women's leadership within the state police force. Designed to bolster professional development and leadership with structured facilitation skills, enhances teamwork, and deepens their understanding of gender-responsive policing. These competencies are essential for delivering positive, community-centric outcomes across police stations," said Gurpreet Kaur, DGP, IPS.

During the inaugural session, Ms. Harikrat Kaur, CEO, Hartek Foundation, outlined the role and responsibilities of master trainers and highlighted the strategic importance of this partnership. She said, "This initiative reflects our commitment to nurturing women leaders within the policing system. By strengthening

## To integrate, strengthen women in force, Punjab Police launches project

THE PUNJAB Police has rolled out a state-wide initiative to strengthen the role and integration of women officers, beginning with a three-day Training of Trainers programme at the Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur.

The "Mainstreaming of Women Police" project, led by the Community Affairs Division in partnership with the Hartek Foundation, trained around 60 master trainers from 13 districts. Each district sent four senior officers who will now conduct training sessions across their jurisdictions.

The curriculum covered modules on shaping police conduct, gender sensitisation, delivering justice to underserved groups and strategies to integrate women personnel in a traditionally male-dominated force. The training also stressed the responsibility of senior officers in supporting the professional growth of women police personnel.

Special DGP, Community Affairs Division, Gurpreet Kaur, said the initiative is part of a larger evidence-based assessment of the nationwide women helpdesk project, under which two women officials have been deployed in each of Punjab's 384 police stations. "This ambitious project aims to build capacity for gender-responsive policing," she said.

For a scientific assessment of the programme's impact, Punjab Police has signed an MoU with the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL), which will conduct Randomised Controlled Trials. Of the 384 police stations, 288 will undergo the training, while 96 will serve as control stations.

The 100 to 120 master trainers selected for the project will receive a second round of advanced training in February 2026. They will then conduct training across the 288 police stations in three phases between March and June 2026, covering issues such as gender stereotypes within policing culture, evolving policing needs, cybercrime, crimes against women and children, and police response and behaviour.

J-PAL will conduct a baseline survey in participating stations before the district-level training begins, followed by an endline survey of both police personnel and citizens to assess changes in gender perceptions and the roles of women in policing. A second Training of Trainers session for officers from the remaining 15 districts is scheduled at PPA Phillaur later this month. In all, over 2,000 police officials are expected to be trained as part of the project.



## Hartek Foundation and Narayan Seva Sansthan join hands to empower 50 disabled with prosthetic limbs

CHANDIGARH: In a landmark move to promote youth empowerment and strengthen community-police relations, the Community Affairs Division (CAD) of Punjab Police and Hartek Foundation have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to collaborate on the Yuva Saanjh Initiative.

This strategic partnership aims to engage vulnerable and at-risk youth across Punjab through structured skill development, counselling, awareness drives, and community-based capacity-building programmes. The Yuva Saanjh Initiative, spearheaded by Punjab Police, seeks to transform community policing by fostering trust, inclusivity, and active participation among the youth.

Under the MoU, Hartek Foundation will provide critical support in standardizing the program's implementation framework. This includes conducting regular training sessions for police officials and Yuva Saanjh Committee members, ensuring a consistent and impactful rollout across districts. The collaboration aims to lay down a comprehensive roadmap that can be replicated throughout the state for maximum effectiveness. The programme's first phase will be piloted in selected districts through the local Saanjh Kendras, under the guidance of the Community Affairs Division.

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## Police and Hartek foundation join hands to empower Punjab's youth through community engagement

एस राय, आइएपीएस, एडीसीपी (ट्रैफिक एवं सड़क सुरक्षा), पंजाब ने कहा, साहस फेलोशिप समालोचकों और सतत सड़क सुरक्षा प्रणाली के निर्माण को दिशा में एक साहसिक कदम है। सुश्री हरकौरत कौर, सीईओ, हरटैक फाउंडेशन ने कहा, वह फेलोशिप पंजाब पुलिस के साथ हमारी गहरी समानता को दर्शाती है। डॉ. नववीप अरोना, निदेशक, पंजाब रोड सेफ्टी एंड ट्रैफिक रिसर्च सेंटर, और सिमरप्रो मिह, कार्यकारी निदेशक एवं सीईओ, हरटैक ग्रुप ने इस पहल को एक ऐसी अग्रणी पहल बताया-जो उभरती सुरक्षा और परिवर्तन चुनौतियों का समाधान करने के लिए सांख्यिक संस्थानों और उद्योग को एक साथ लाती है।

गौरव यादव, आइएपीएस, पुलिस महानिदेशक, पंजाब ने बल देते हुए कहा, पुलिसिंग में, विशेष रूप से ट्रैफिक और सड़क सुरक्षा में, लिंग समावेशिता को लाना हमारी मूल प्राथमिकता है। 33 प्रतिशत महिला कर्मियों वाली सड़क सुरक्षा बल की शुरुआत एक बुनियादी कदम था। अब साहस फेलोशिप के साथ हम सड़क सुरक्षा प्रणालियों में लिंग समानता को संस्थागत रूप देने की दिशा में आगे बढ़ रहे हैं।

# PEOPLE SUPPORTED

Hartek Foundation's immediate response to the Punjab floods prioritized supporting affected communities across Hoshiarpur, Gurdaspur and Ferozepur. The Foundation provided essential relief, including supplies, hygiene kits, temporary shelter, medical aid and solar lighting. In Gurdaspur, recent efforts included rebuilding 10 homes and installing electrical fittings, helping families restore safe living conditions and accelerate recovery. Working closely with district authorities, the Indian Red Cross Society, Global Sikhs, and local partners, the Foundation ensured a timely emergency response while laying the groundwork for longer-term rehabilitation



Hartek Foundation, together with Hartek Group, stood united during challenging times by providing temporary relief to families in the villages of Gurdaspur and Ferozepur. In collaboration with Global Sikhs, the team distributed essential supplies and offered immediate assistance, demonstrating Hartek's ongoing commitment to community welfare and support for those in need.



Demonstrating their commitment to community welfare, Hartek Foundation donated essential supplies to the District Administration and the Indian Red Cross Society in Hoshiarpur. Moreover, in partnership with the Tera Hi Tera Foundation, Hartek Foundation further extended crucial support to flood-affected families by providing hygiene kits for women, temporary shelter for displaced households, and basic medical supplies to ensure immediate relief and care.



The floods in Gurdaspur, Punjab, caused widespread devastation, severely impacting vulnerable families and leaving many without safe shelter or basic amenities. Homes were damaged or destroyed, and essential infrastructure, including electrical systems, was disrupted, making everyday life both unsafe and uncertain for the affected communities.



In response, Hartek Foundation stepped in with a strong commitment to support recovery efforts by enabling the reconstruction of damaged homes and installing essential electrical fittings in each restored house. This initiative not only helped rebuild physical structures but also restored a sense of safety, stability, and dignity, playing a vital role in accelerating the community's path to recovery.

# YOUTH BENEFITTED

Hartek Foundation positively impacted students and youth through education-focused interventions, including experiential STEM learning through Skill Labs, along with safety awareness, menstrual hygiene, first aid and disaster preparedness, mental wellness, and school infrastructure improvements. These initiatives promoted safe, inclusive, and well-equipped learning environments while strengthening life skills and social awareness among adolescents.



Bridging the Gap in Science Education through STEM Labs. Many underprivileged students in government schools lack access to well-equipped laboratories, limiting hands-on learning and making it difficult to fully understand scientific concepts. This gap restricts curiosity, critical thinking, and interest in STEM careers.



To address this, Hartek Foundation launched STEM Labs under its Hartek Skill Lab Initiative, reaching over seven schools with 160+ educational models. These interactive labs bridge the gap between theory and practice, helping students grasp concepts better and explore opportunities in emerging fields.



On National Youth Day, Hartek Foundation, with RGNIID Chandigarh and the Ministry of Youth Affairs, organized art activities and a painting competition to encourage creativity, leadership, and social awareness among students, promoting nation-building and positive change.



Hartek Foundation, with Punjab Police Community Affairs Division and Red Cross Society Mohali, conducted First Aid and Disaster Management training for Student Police Cadets at Government High School, Nagal Salempur. The session provided hands-on training in CPR and fracture management, empowering youth to respond to emergencies and disasters.



On World Population Day, Hartek Foundation organised an awareness session on POCSO at Government Senior Secondary School, Bakarpur. The session focused on body safety, consent, boundaries, and protection from abuse among adolescents.



Guided by its "Power to Serve" mission, Hartek Foundation fosters student well-being by building safe, sustainable, and well-equipped learning environments. As part of this effort, a 1000-litre water tank was installed at the School of Eminence in Bakarpur, Mohali, Punjab, improving access to clean drinking water. Tree plantation drives and environmental awareness sessions were also conducted, promoting sustainability and responsible practices among students. These initiatives have enhanced hygiene, environmental consciousness, and the overall learning environment.

## LIVES SUSTAINED

Hartek Foundation promoted SDG 13 through initiatives with government departments and civil society organizations. Tree plantation drives were conducted in Village Kasoli, while cleanliness drives in Village Daun promoted dry and wet waste management through dustbin installation. On World Environment Day, the Foundation donated water tanks and conducted tree plantation at the School of Eminence, Bakarpur, supporting SDG 6 goals.



The Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with the Forest Department and the Gram Panchayat, organized a large-scale tree plantation drive in Village Kasoli, Punjab. The event engaged over 150 participants, including local SHGs, to foster community-led environmental sustainability and a greener future.



In a dedicated effort to promote environmental sustainability and raise awareness about responsible waste management, Hartek Foundation led a comprehensive cleanliness drive in Village Daun, located in the Mohali district of Punjab. To support the “Beat Plastic Pollution” campaign and promote responsible waste management practices, separate dustbins for dry and wet waste were thoughtfully installed at the event site.



# COMMUNITY AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT.

## SKILLS ENABLED

Hartek Foundation promoted community and skill development through Training of Trainers and gender sensitization programs. It supported persons with disabilities by providing 50 artificial limbs, along with computer training for rehabilitation patients. Youth engagement activities like street plays, langar seva, and educational screenings at Prabh Aasra Trust further strengthened inclusion and community participation across Punjab.



The Hartek Foundation, in partnership with the Punjab Police (Community Affairs Division), and J-PAL South Asia conducted a three-day Training of Trainers (ToT) programme to advance women's mainstreaming in policing. Guided by the Special DGP, the initiative trained 140 master trainers in gender-responsive policing, legal frameworks, sensitisation, training Pedagogy and life skills. These trainers will now cascade this knowledge across their respective districts to institutionalise inclusive and gender-sensitive practices throughout the Punjab Police force.



The Hartek Foundation successfully launched the second phase of this programme across 28 districts in Punjab, training over 2,000 police officials. The initiative focused on gender-responsive policing and a victim-centric approach, integrating legal frameworks and empathy into daily law enforcement. By strengthening these capacities at scale, the intervention has significantly advanced a more inclusive and effective policing system throughout the state.



Hartek Foundation presented the draft Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) under the Youth Positive Engagement Program to the Community Affairs Division (CAD) and ADGP Intelligence, Punjab Police. Consultations were held in Mohali with participation from representatives of SAS Nagar (Mohali), Rupnagar, Patiala, and Fatehgarh Sahib. The sessions enabled stakeholder feedback and resulted in key recommendations focused on strengthening youth engagement strategies, improving coordination, and standardizing implementation practices across districts.



Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with Punjab Police, organized a street play (Nukkad Natak) in Mohali on International Drug Abuse Day under the Yuva Saanjh Project. The initiative raised awareness on the harmful effects of drug abuse and promoted prevention and support-based recovery, encouraging youth to adopt healthier and more responsible lifestyles.



On International Youth Day, Hartek Foundation, with Punjab Police Community Affairs Division, celebrated with Student Police Cadets at Lawrence Public School, Mohali. A painting competition on “Innovation with Imagination” encouraged creativity, while dignitaries motivated students on innovation and determination. Winners were awarded, and students were inspired to shape a better future.



Hartek Foundation, in collaboration with Narayan Seva Sansthan, facilitated the distribution of 50 artificial limbs to individuals with physical disabilities. This initiative aimed to restore mobility and independence, enabling beneficiaries to actively participate in education, employment, and community life.



In remembrance of Chaar Sahibzaade, Hartek Foundation organized an educational movie screening and Langar Sewa at Prabh Aasra. The initiative highlighted the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, focusing on equality, compassion, and sacrifice, while the team also served langar to promote dignity and community bonding.



Hartek Foundation launched a computer training program at Sector 66 Rehabilitation Centre, Mohali under the Hartek Skill Lab initiative. The program provides hands-on training in basic computer skills, typing, and internet use, supporting rehabilitation and empowering participants with digital skills for a better future.

Hartek Foundation strengthened rural healthcare through its commitment to preventive and inclusive care, conducting health camps across rural villages in district S.A.S Nagar Mohali. These initiatives provided essential check-ups, screenings, consultations, and medicines, alongside cancer awareness, menstrual hygiene sessions, anaemia testing, blood donation drives & expanding healthcare access in underserved communities.



Hartek Foundation places a strong emphasis on improving women's health through targeted interventions. Special focus was given to anaemia management and the distribution of sanitary napkins to promote better hygiene practices. Awareness sessions on menstrual hygiene and breast cancer were also conducted to encourage early detection, prevention, and reduced health risks. These initiatives aim to strengthen preventive healthcare practices and enhance overall community well-being.

## Addressing Critical Health Gaps (NFHS-5 Insights)

- "According to the National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5, 2019–21), over 57% of women in India are anaemic, highlighting the urgent need for targeted interventions."<sup>1</sup>
- "NFHS-5 (2019–21) data also indicates persistent gaps in access to preventive healthcare in rural areas, reinforcing the importance of community-based health camps and awareness initiatives."<sup>1</sup>

Empowering 250+ women across 30 Self Help Groups (SHGs), Hartek Foundation strengthened economic independence through skill-based livelihoods and institutional partnerships. With initiatives ranging from tailoring and stitching to Phulkari integration into corporate supply chains, women earned an average monthly income of ₹27,000, fostering entrepreneurship, confidence and long-term financial security.



Hartek Foundation strengthened the Hartek Skill Lab in village Daun, district Mohali, by donating advanced machines and equipment to enhance the quality of practical training. This initiative focuses on bridging the gap between theoretical learning and hands-on technical exposure, enabling women to gain real-world experience and build confidence in using industry-grade tools and technologies.



Through this support, the Foundation aims to empower SHG women with industry-relevant skills, improving their employability and opening pathways to sustainable livelihoods. The initiative represents a significant step toward economic independence for women in the region while also contributing to long-term community development and resilience.
